# IMPACT OF SATELLITE IN DISASTER IMAGERY


In the state of the satellite imagery can assist in the areas ahead of a hurricane, provide a wide area view of impacted areas for response officials, and show the level of change to an area to prioritize restoration and mitigation efforts.








### PRE-EVENT IMAGERY



The State of Florida utilizes a combination of NOAA satellite, Google Earth, and low-level fixed-wing aircraft to survey the potential affected area(s) before a noticed event, such as a hurricane. Vulnerable locations such as barrier islands, beaches, bays, and coastally coupled riverine basins are captured, followed by other sensitive areas such as repetitive flood loss areas or areas recently impacted by a disaster (1-2 years or less)

Having recent high-resolution imagery is critical for response and recovery efforts. Satellite and fixed-wing images pre-event can show ongoing construction, congested areas, beach erosion and other potential hazards that could increase an areas vulnerability.


